See it **T**hrough (Matt 7:21-23)

²⁰ for the **anger** of man does not produce the righteousness that God requires.

²¹Therefore <u>put away all filthiness and</u> <u>rampant wickedness</u> and receive with **meekness** the implanted word, which is able to save your souls.

²² But be <u>doers</u> of the word, and not <u>hearers</u> only, deceiving yourselves.

²³ For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who <u>looks intently at</u> his natural face in a mirror.

²⁴ For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like.

25 But the one who <u>looks into</u> the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a <u>doer who acts</u>, he will be **blessed in his doing**.

²⁶ If anyone thinks he is **religious** and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless.

²⁷ **Religion** that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.
