*Most people want to be heard (1:19).

Deep in the Bible

- *What better way to be heard as a believer than to be a teacher?
- *We must not be hasty in putting ourselves into a position where the tongue is constantly used.
- *It is powerful and as such will incur a "greater strictness".
- *The more we use our words, the more likely we will be to stumble.

*The tongue has So Much power over the body that James concludes "no human being can tame the tongue."

Verse 14 Connects James' teaching on Wisdom to the Tongue

Boasting & Being False

*Boasting and being false are two things that we can do with our tongue, and James says these things come from a **heart** with "jealousy and selfish ambition," which are signs of wisdom that is "earthly, unspiritual, demonic."

James 3:1-18

¹ Not many of you should become **teachers**, my brothers, for you know that we who teach will be judged with greater strictness. ² For we all stumble in many ways, and if anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle his whole body. Tsin

³ If we put **bits** into the mouths of **horses** so that they obey us, we guide their whole bodies as well.

⁴ Look at the **ships** also: though they are so *large* and are driven by strong winds, they are guided by a very small rudder wherever the will of the pilot directs.

⁵ So also the **tongue** is a *small* member, yet it boasts of *great* things. How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire! ⁶ And the **tongue** is a **fire**, a world of unrighteousness. The tongue is set among our members, staining the whole body, setting on **fire** the entire course of life, and set on **fire** by hell. ⁷ For every kind of **beast** and **bird**, of **reptile** and **sea creature**, can be tamed and has been tamed by mankind, 8 but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. <- Ps 140:3 | Gen 1:27 ⁹ With it we **bless** our Lord and Father, and with it we **curse** people who are made in the likeness of God. 10 From the same *We may think that we

mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so. 11 Does a spring pour forth from the same words, but do we truly opening both fresh and salt water? 12 Can a fig tree, my brothers, bear olives, or a grapevine produce figs? Neither can a salt pond yield fresh water. <- Illustrations



II. Your Heart Must Be Changed (13-18)

¹³ Who is **wise** and understanding among you? By his good **F** conduct let him show his works in the meekness of wisdom. ¹⁴ But if you have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts, do not boast and be false to the truth. 15 This is not the wisdom that comes down from above, but is earthly, unspiritual, demonic. 16 For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice. ¹⁷ But the **wisdom** from above is first *pure*, then *peaceable*, gentle, open to reason, full of mercy and good fruits, impartial and sincere. ¹⁸ And a *harvest* of *righteousness* is sown in peace by those who make peace. <- Signs of Heavenly Wisdom

Wisdom

*It may seem that James is changing topics to focus on earthly wisdom vs. heavenly wisdom.

*However, he ties this to the tongue in v. 14 when he warns those who "have bitter jealousy and selfish ambition in your hearts" to "not boast and be false in the truth."

What is in Your Heart? - Words are driven by what is on our hearts. This is consistent with what Jesus said in Mt 12:33-35, "How can you speak good, when you are evil? For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks." Humans cannot transform their own hearts. But, if we allow God to transform our hearts and minds (Ps 51:10), we can be one whose tongue is used to sow peace instead of destruction.
