
### Chapter 1

## Luke 1:1-4 (ESV)

<sup>1</sup> Inasmuch as many have undertaken to compile a narrative of the things that have been accomplished among us, 2 just as those who from the beginning were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word have delivered them to us, 3 it seemed good to me also, having followed all things closely for some time past, to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, 4 that you may have certainty concerning the things you have been taught.

### Acts 3:1-6 (ESV)





## Acts 3:7-10 (ESV)

<sup>7</sup> And he took him by the right hand and raised him up, and immediately his feet and ankles were made strong. 8 And leaping up, he stood and began to walk, and entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God. 9 And all the people saw him walking and praising God, 10 and recognized him as the one who sat at the Beautiful Gate of the temple, asking for alms. And they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.

### Romans 1:18-20 (ESV)



## Psalm 19:1-3 (ESV)

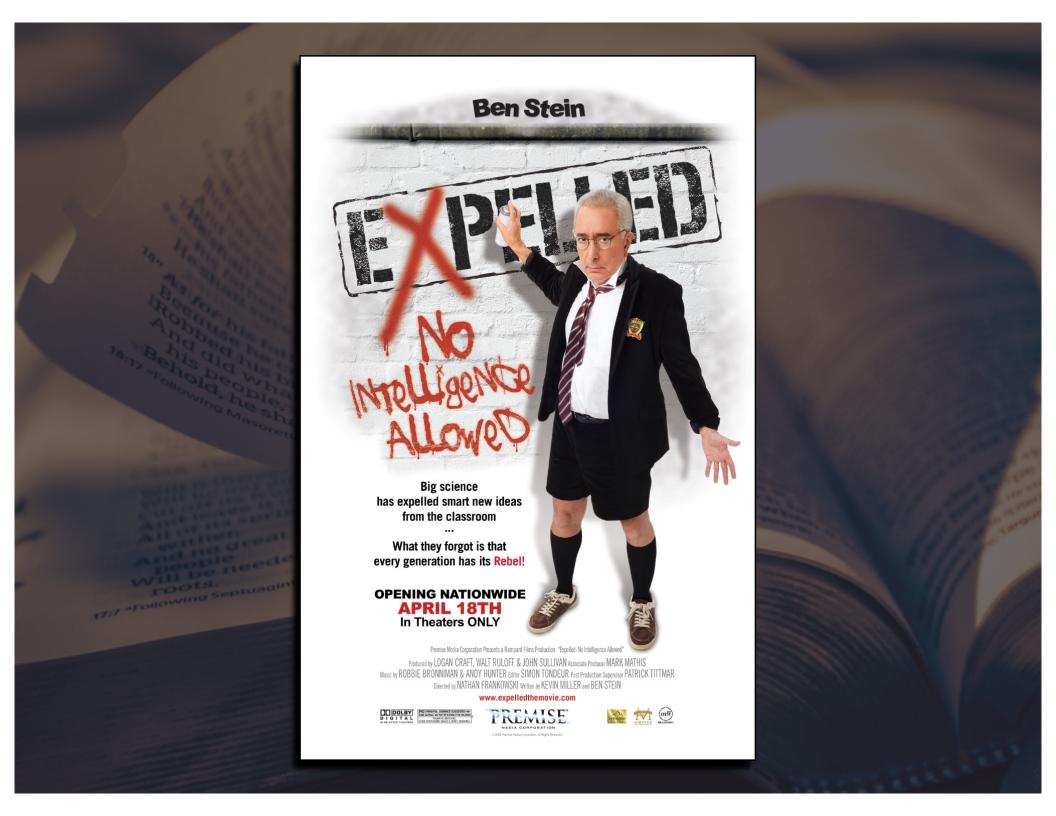
- <sup>1</sup> The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork.

Elaine Ecklund, a sociologist at Rice University conducted a detailed survey of nearly 1700 scientists at elite American research universities (including Columbia, Cornell, Duke, Harvard, Johns Hopkins, MIT, Princeton, Stanford, Yale and others) and conducted 275 follow up interviews, the most comprehensive study to date on the religious beliefs of elite scientists. In her book "Science vs. Religion: What Scientists Really Think", she revealed that nearly half of the scientists surveyed claimed to be religious with 20 percent attending worship on a regular basis. She noted that many of these scientists practiced a "closeted faith" fearing ridicule by their peers and professional repercussions
