

But far be it from me to boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world.

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

The Truth is Always the Truth, Regardless of Who States It!

Templeton's challenge turns out to be nothing more than an argumentum ad hominem

An irrelevant attack upon a person to deflect an argument from the facts and reasons

Are We Arrogant to Believe and Teach that Jesus is the Only Way?



John 14:6 (ESV)
Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

John 3:16-18 (ESV)

16 "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. 17 For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him. 18 Whoever believes in him is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

Acts 4:10-12 (ESV)

10 let it be known to all of you and to all the people of Israel that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead -by him this man is standing before you well. 11 This Jesus is the stone that was rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone. 12 And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved."

Our pluralistic society likes to assert that all religions are one of many roads to the same destination.

This is not possible because many religions make contradictory claims.

Many Paths to the Same Destination?

Christians believe that Jesus is the Son of God. Jews believe that Jesus was a false prophet and not the Son of God. Muslims believe that Jesus was merely a prophet of Allah and not the Son of God.

Under **no circumstances** can Jesus be both the Son of God and not the Son of God, nor can he be a true and false prophet

Atheism vs. Theism

Atheism and theism both make a single contradictory claim. Atheism claims there is no God; theism claims that there is a God. One position has to be right and one has to be wrong. There is no third option. God exists or He does not.

"A student made this claim, that all religions are basically the same, at University of California, Irvine, when I lectured on campus. I remember turning around to the board behind me and drawing two small circles, and then asking the young lady, who had made this comment, if the circles, in her mind, were basically the same. They were about tablet size. And she looked at the circles. She said, 'Yeah, those are basically the same.' And then labeled one 'aspirin,' and I labeled the other 'arsenic.' Then I asked her the same question: 'Now do you think they're both basically the same?' And she said, 'No.' I said, 'The point is, it's the differences that matter. Saying that all religions are basically the same is like saying that aspirin and arsenic are basically the same because they both can come in tablet form. It's the differences that matter."
